As We Gather

"In Him was life" (John 1:4). If you have ever had the opportunity to witness the birth of a child, it's difficult to not be in awe of a new life entering the world. A newborn baby is full of life! Yet the

Christ Child born that first Christmas is full of life in an even greater way. This child, the Word made flesh, is born, lives, dies, and rises to give life to the world. "In Him was life." Confession and Absolution

Nicene Creed
