Vindication As We Gather

In Psalm 41:7–8, David lamented, "All who hate me whisper together about me; they imagine the worst for me. They say, 'A deadly thing is poured out on him; he will not rise again from where he lies." These words pointed forward to our Lord Jesus Christ, who rose again in defiance of His enemies. Do you have enemies who whisper and scheme against you? Have you been brought low—perhaps so low that you despair of ever rising again? Jesus was vindicated in His resurrection, and you shall be too. You can have certainty in your resurrection and vindication because Jesus Christ is risen.

- P By this I know that You delight in me: my enemy will not shout in triumph over me.
- C But You have upheld me because of my integrity, and set me in Your presence forever.
 Blessed be the LORD, the God of Israel, from everlasting to everlasting! Amen and Amen.
 - Glory be to the Father and to the Son and to the Holy Spirit; as it was in the beginning, is now, and will be forever. Amen.

Epistle 2 Timothy 3:1–9

P The Epistle is from Second Timothy, the third chapter.

¹But understand this, that in the last days there will come times of difficulty. ²For people will be lovers of self, lovers of money, proud, arrogant, abusive, disobedient to their parents, ungrateful, unholy, ³heartless, unappeasable, slanderous, without self-control, brutal, not loving good, ⁴treacherous, reckless, swollen with conceit, lovers of pleasure rather than lovers of God, ⁵having the appearance of godliness, but denying its power. Avoid such people. ⁶For among them are those who creep into households and capture weak women, burdened with sins and led astray by various passions, ⁷always learning and never able to arrive at a knowledge of the truth. ⁸Just as Jannes and Jambres opposed Moses, so these men also oppose the truth, men corrupted in mind and disqualified regarding the faith. ⁹But they will not get very far, for their folly will be plain to all, as was that of those two men.

Sermon Psalm 41:7–8

Hymn Introduction

P In the closing stanza of "My Song Is Love Unknown," Samuel Crossman uses a special term for Jesus, whose ministry and suffering and sacrifice have been described in the preceding stanzas. "This is my friend," the author states confidently. In speaking with the disciples in the Upper Room on the night in which He was betrayed, Jesus said, "Greater love has no one than this, that someone lays down his life for his friends. You are My friends if you do what I command you" (John 15:13–14). Jesus commanded His disciples to love one another, reflecting the deep and amazing love that He was showing them then and would be fully demonstrating in the next hours of His Passion. Jesus is our friend for time and eternity, whose "sweet praise" we now sing.
