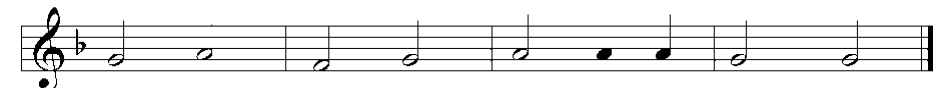

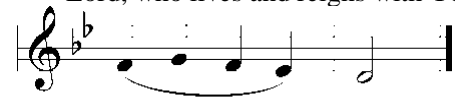

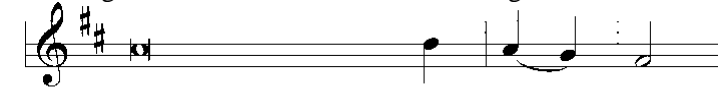
Nunc Dimittis
